Asynchronous Strategies

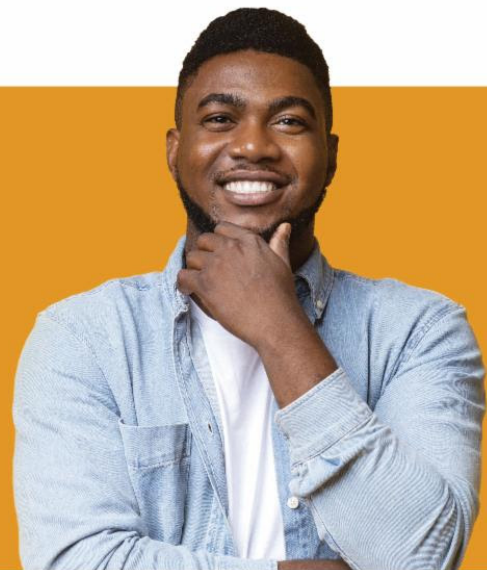
- Visuals, Routines, Schedules
