

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Top Five Hybrid Learning Strategies for 2021



Last year presented educators with a unique opportunity to explore remote and hybrid learning models. As a result, educators have developed new, creative methods to engage their students using a digital platform. As we navigate through an increasingly digital world with more people working and learning from home, it's important to have an effective model for hybrid learning.

Top Five Hybrid Learning Strategies:

1) Involve Parents

Parents need guidance from educators. This often involves setting expectations, coaching them, and providing packets of information for parents experiencing technology challenges.

2) Engage Students with Hands-On Methods at Home

Design lessons that use basic household items. Have students create videos with their smartphones to showcase new skills and demonstrate competencies.

3) Share the Curriculum Online

Transfer materials to Google Drive and use it on Google Classroom. Use Google Slides to deliver "First Look" and "Activity Overviews" where teachers can read and talk about each slide, just as they would in the classroom.



4) Assign Group Work

Encourage students to interact and learn together by assigning group work. Make sure the work you assign engages each member of the group and allows them to contribute in their own unique way.

5) Have a Virtual Career Day

Have your students proudly show off their new knowledge and skills with a "Virtual Career Day". At the end of the semester, students can share videos or slide shows of the new career and life skills they've acquired.
