THREE KEY STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESS



KEEP IT SIMPLE

If you're struggling to find real-world experiences to connect with your life skills curriculum, try selecting ones that seem intuitive to you. Here are some ideas:

- Banking to currency identification or decimal places
- Negotiation to oral presentations or writing argumentative pieces
- Food & kitchen safety to fractions, nutrition, or chemistry
- Transportation to clock reading, speed, or map reading



GET TECHNOLOGY INVOLVED

Technology is your best friend! Here are some platforms to use to make your curriculum more fun & engaging for the students, along with how to incorporate them:




Google Forms	Create Assessments that can automatically place student responses in an Excel spreadsheet.
Kahoot	Gamify content review for assessments (plus, the students will love the music!)
PearDeck	Make slides interactive for students. For example, they can draw a picture or respond to questions on the slide. Plus, this platform has an extension for the G-Suite!



ADD NEW TOOLS TO YOUR TEACHING TOOLBOX

- Invite guest speakers from the community to speak on a topic. Think about bankers, real estate agents, landlords, or grocery clerks.
- Incorporate activities that you do in real life (making a grocery list, balancing a checkbook, job interviewing, etc.)
- Integrate daily questions that relate to social & emotional learning skills and self-advocacy (e.g. "Where do you want to live?" when talking about transportation, renting an apartment.)
