- Build a <u>sense of pride and unity</u> by involving therapists, teachers, and other departments. When a team is working toward a <u>unified goal</u>, the students benefit!
- Partner with <u>local businesses</u> to help students find job placements. Getting a sense of the community early can ease their transition period.
- Getting buy-in from parents can make a world of difference! They can re-enforce what you are teaching in the classroom.

# DRIVEN BY DATA

Statistics and data should be the driving factor in all that we do. When we have good data, we can make good decisions! Here are some ways that we can utilize data we collect:

- IEPs require <u>careful</u> <u>documentation</u> and data collection. Tracking student progress should be a crucial part of evaluation.
- Data can help support your ideas for implementing systemic change, like <u>decreasing dropout</u> <u>rates</u> or changing teacher:student ratios.
- Set goals for your students that are attainable based off of data you've collected from them.

While we want to create robust transition programs, we must also be **thoughtful** and **practical** when it comes to how we build our strategy. Our programs should positively impact students in order to be effective!

- Give students <u>multiple avenues</u> for career exploration. Students may love the idea of certain jobs, but there may be components they haven't considered until they "try it on" for themselves.
- Put student safety first in placements.
   There should be clear expectations outlined with both the employer and student regarding activities that are appropriate for work study.
- Great programs are not built overnight.
   <u>Start small</u>, see what works for your students, and make adjustments!

Resources are meant to be used, so take advantage of them! Sometimes we miss out on resources because we don't know where to find them! Here are different categories of resources to look for:


