Often, students with cognitive disabilities are not given the same opportunities to achieve these goals as their peers.

Nicole Lowers M. Ed, is a secondary/transition-aged
autistic support and life skills support teacher with
Intermediate Unit One in McMurray, PA, a Pittsburgh
Suburb.

She has over 12 years of teaching experience in settings that include students with autism and intellectual disabilities. The first 6 years of her teaching career was spent in alternative education settings working with secondary students with emotional and behavioral disabilities. In addition to assisting students with increasing vocational skills, she also provides curriculum to increase verbal behavior, functional communication, daily living, and academic skills. In 2023, she developed a daily living lab at her school to increase independent living skills.

Independent living skills (like


- laundry or banking)

- Verbal behavior training (milestone assessment & placement)
- Direct instruction (model, lead, test, retest)
- Visual schedules (real photos to demonstrate steps to complete an activity)

Tip of the Day: PERCENTAGE GRAPHS & PARENTS

One great way to share results with parents is to create a percentage graph that illustrates the level of independence students have gained during various activities based on a rubric. The data points could be based on the amount of prompting a student needed for different tasks over time. This is a great way to illustrate student progress to parents/guardians, IEP teams, or to add to a portfolio.
