and bounds. We saw a decrease in student dropout by more than 50%." This statistic includes students whose parents pulled them out for homeschooling and/or moving them to other schools in search of better transition programs.

They started with just a few students enrolled to a full schedule at the high school level. The Pre-ETS Program has even partnered with Vocational Rehab to expand the reach of opportunities and resources for students.
